**Subject: Temporary Water Service Interruption – March 26, 2025**

Dear Residents,

We are writing to inform you of a planned **water service interruption** scheduled for **Wednesday, March 26, 2025**, from approximately **9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.**

This temporary shutdown is necessary to **tie in the new pipelines installed in the well field to the existing distribution line on Whispering Pines Road**. This work is part of our ongoing efforts to improve system reliability and water delivery to our community.

**Affected Area:**

All homes **east of Pinetree Drive on Whispering Pines Road**, including **Jay Court (Lots #1 through #14)**.

We recommend that affected residents **store enough water** for personal use during this time and **limit water-dependent activities** until service is restored. Once your service is restored, please reference the attached Boil Water Notice.

# BOIL WATER NOTICE

### Boil Your Water Before Drinking or Food Preparation to Avoid Illness

Due to the recent pipeline connection, which occurred on 03/26/2025, the State Water Resources Control Board, Division of Drinking Water, the Kern County Health Department, and the Pinon Pines Mutual Water Company are advising residents of Pinon Pines Estates to only use boiled tap water or bottled water for drinking and cooking purposes as a safety precaution to avoid stomach or intestinal illness. The affected area includes: Lots #1 – 14, houses east of Pinetree Rd. on Whispering Pines Rd. and Jay Ct.

We will inform you when tests show that water is safe to drink, and you no longer need to boil your water. We anticipate resolving the problem within 24 hours.

### Do not drink the water without boiling it first

- Boil all water for one (1) minute (rolling boil).
- Let water cool before drinking.
- Use boiled or bottled water for drinking, brushing teeth, and food preparation until further notice.
- Boiling water kills bacteria and other organisms in the water.

### If you are unable to boil your water:

Household unscented liquid bleach

- For clear water, use 8 drops (1/8 tsp.) of bleach for 1 gallon of water. For cloudy water, filter through a clean cloth and use 16 drops (1/4 tsp.) of bleach for 1 gallon of water.
- Mix well. Allow to stand for 30 minutes before using.
- Water may taste or smell like chlorine. This means disinfection has occurred.

Water disinfection tablets

- Please follow the manufacturer's instructions.
